CFE Tool of the Month

Circle of Trust: Provides a visual of connection, or lack of connection. COT provides insight on how youth see themselves and on whom they can trust in their lives. This tool is normally a 5-layer circle with the person



completing the circle being at the center.

- 1- Intimate Circle is reserved for people who are the closest to you; you can trust them with your eyes closed, usually a partner, children, parents and/or siblings.
- 2- Circle of Medium Trust are people that we can ask favors, spend time with, and we talk to about many topics; normally friends, teachers, religious leaders, and relatives are located here.
- 3- Circle of Poor Trust are people with whom you have a relationship, but you don't trust with your secrets and don't ask for favors. Normally these are classmates, co-workers or distant relatives.
- 4- Circle of Very Little Trust are people you know or speak with on occasions. Kids in other classes, neighbors down the street, store clerks, professional personnel such as firemen, policemen etc.
- 5- Circle of Mistrust are unknown people with whom you have not established any kind of relationship or with whom you have exchanged a casual conversation. At the start of a case, a youth could place their CASA and PCM here. People can move in and out of the circle depending on situations.
